




"Because really, Western medicine they treat the ailment, not the person. And there's no criticism to that, merely because that's all we know; so, if that's what you know, that's what you do. But to hear that Rongoā Māori and Western medicine was being merged and blended like this in a really authentic way, where two people who have respect for each other and respect for their talents and their profession, for me, that's really important. And that for me, is Rongoā treating the body first, because it's looking at his whatumanawa [heart/emotions] and wairua [spirit] and putting that at ease first, and then let's talk about the body. So that for me, just seeing that relationship and even hearing that korero [discussion], that summed up for me exactly why it's working."




